## STEFAN SEREGARD, M.D., PH.D., Professor of Ophthalmology, Karolinska Institutet CURRICULUM VITAE

## SUMMARY

Stefan Seregard completed residencies in surgical pathology and ophthalmology at Karolinska Hospital and St Eriks Eye Hospital in Stockholm and was board certified in both anatomical pathology and ophthalmology in 1992. The training period also included a fellowship in ophthalmic pathology completed at the Institute of Ophthalmology, London, UK in 1991.

Stefan Seregard is currently Professor of Ophthalmology at Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm, Sweden and Chairman, Department of Vitreoretinal Diseases, St Eriks Eye Hospital and Director, Ophthalmic Pathology and Oncology Service, St Eriks Eye Hospital, Stockholm, Sweden. The Ophthalmic Pathology and Oncology Service is the only Swedish unit for the management of ocular tumours and this unit includes the only eye pathology laboratory in Sweden. The Vireoretinal Department is the largest facility for the surgical and medical management of these diseases in Scandinavia.

His research interests are focused on the epidemiological, molecular genetical, prognostic, histopathological and psychological aspects on uveal and conjunctival melanoma, but include other fields like choroidal and retinal neovascularization. Seregard has authored or co-authored nearly 200 scientific publications including textbook chapters, and original and review papers. He travels extensively, lectures widely and has held numerous invited and eponymous lectures. Stefan Seregard is associate editor or section editor of European Journal of Ophthalmology, British Journal of Ophthalmology, Acta Ophthalmologica and Survey of Ophthalmology. He has supervised twelve PhD students to dissertation with financial support including several unrestricted grants from the Swedish Medical Research Council.

Stefan Seregard is Past President of the European Society of Ophthalmology (SOE), the Swedish Ophthalmological Society and the European Society of Ophthalmic Pathology (EOPS). He is the former International Advisor to the Board of Trustees, American Academy of Ophthalmology.
